The findings suggest that given sufficient civil-society coordination, social media can be an effective tool for electoral scrutiny. Furthermore, for this and other reasons, it appears that social media has the potential to emerge as a key influence on public faith in electoral processes. Based on these results, it is further argued that social media's true disruptive power in developing world contexts lies in its ability to transcend the economics of scarcity that have dominated traditional media in such contexts. This observation is offered as an extension to the networked public sphere theory of Yochai Benkler that frames this work.

Presidential Power in Latin America Jan 29 2021 What explains variance in presidential power between countries? In *Presidential Power in Latin America*, Dan Berbece provides a general, systematic theory for explaining presidential power in practice as opposed to presidential power in theory. Using expert survey data from *Varieties of Democracy (V-Dem)* alongside interviews with high-level figures in politics, the judiciary, the public administration, NGOs, and academia in Argentina and Chile, Berbece argues that constitutional presidential power (formal power) is a very poor predictor of presidential power in practice (informal power). Given the poor predictive value of formal rules, he provides an explanation why hyperpresidentialism emerges in some countries but not in others. Berbece attributes the root causes of hyperpresidentialism to three independent variables (weak state institutions, the size of the president's party in congress, and a history of economic crises) which together determine how likely it is that a president will be able to concentrate power. *Presidential Power in Latin America* will be of key interest to scholars and students of executive politics, Latin American politics and more broadly comparative politics.
